



Indian Women Network's ambition is to provide a secure and comfortable networking platform for women. The impact that IWN aspires for, is a marked transformation in the position of women in corporates and society, through sustained policy advocacy for enabling ecosystem and continuous learning & development activities. The formative years' action agenda was outreach programmes to bring more women from corporates and entrepreneurs into the IWN ambit. Since its launch in January 2013 at Chennai IWN expanded its footprints across the southern states of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Telangana and Puducherry with zonal offices in Coimbatore, Madurai, Trichy, Vijayawada.

IWN has been founded on a strong framework to engage and enable career women, entrepreneurs, final year students in three focus areas - Learning & Development, Well-being, Policy & Advocacy, several events were organized for the benefit of members.

IWN organised events focused on skill enhancement, personality development, and career advancement under the Learning and Development Task Force. These events aimed to equip women with the necessary tools to thrive in their professional endeavors. IWN facilitated international collaborations, with members participating in training programs such as the CII HIDA training program on empowerment for women leaders in India, held in Tokyo. 2013-15 saw IWN SR set forth its commitment to continue facilitating the growth of women through various initiatives aimed at fostering knowledge, skills, and equal opportunities for inclusive growth and economic parity. 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2016 - 2017 : Reaching New Heights

IWN works actively in Educating, Engaging, Encouraging and Empowering women, as the 4 essential tools in enhancing the competitiveness and growth of industries and economy. More and more women are entering the workforce, taking up the challenge of multitasking and prioritization, even managing to strike a work-life balance considering their various roles as a wife, a mother, and a professional. The progress achieved indeed is quite significant and worthy to be applauded.

Anu Sriram's tenure as Chairwoman IWN SR marked several key initiatives were undertaken to support and advance the professional growth of women across various sectors.

International partnerships were established, including with the UN Women-Citi Workshop on Gender-Responsive Procurement in November 2016, aimed at sharing knowledge and best practices about inclusive sourcing / supply chain diversity. Additionally, IWN was acknowledged as a Cooperation Partner at the 4th Annual Summit-Global Female Leaders 2017 in Germany. A significant agenda was to develop a broad base of qualified Women Independent Directors, in line with the mandate set by India's market regulator SEBI for listed companies. A flagship program in collaboration with the Indian School of Business (ISB) facilitated a three-day residential Governance Programme for Independent Directors in June 2016. Gender parity remained a central theme, with efforts focused on setting standards for diversity and inclusivity and recognizing organizations with excellent standards through the CII IWN Gender Parity Awards held in June 2017 in Chennai.

Policy interventions were also emphasized, including feedback submission on the Maternity Benefit (Amendment) Bill 2016 and engagement with government officials such as Dr. Kiran Bedi, IPS (Retd.), Lt. Governor, Government of Puducherry, to discuss initiatives supporting working women. Workshops were conducted on the Prevention of Sexual Harassment Act at Workplace (Prohibitions & Redressal) Act 2013 across various cities, aimed at enhancing awareness and understanding of the legal provisions among directors and senior management personnel. IWN's membership grew steadily, in the region with ongoing efforts to expand further by reaching out to CII member companies and higher educational institutions. The term was a benchmark for continued success in enabling growth and development of women leaders and enabling them to realize their true potential through the organization's unique networking platform.

During her tenure as the IWN Regional Chairwoman, Ms Rina Vivekanandan focussed on sustaining the momentum that was built in IWN over the previous years. 


































Over the last few years pre-pandemic, significant progress has been made in building inclusive and equitable workplaces. Fresh forms of conversations and practices were opening to empower individuals from diverse backgrounds to achieve their full potential and thrive at work.

While there are many examples where women have been demonstrating strong leadership through recent global challenges, the journey towards driving successful outcomes both on a personal and organisational level is often not equal for women leaders compared to that of men. The pandemic saw female leaders around the globe have risen to the external challenges by supporting individual's needs, prioritising health and well-being, and taking steps to improve workplace inclusivity.

Riding on the success of the last two editions of the program, the third - Evempower mentorship cohort achieved a total number of 200 pairs against its target of 200+ mentors and mentees for the year 2022-23.
